PASTOR'S VIEWPOINT

The virus seems to have met a match with the vaccine. The recent indications point towards the re-opening of what the virus succeeded in closing down. I am planning to follow the inspiration of an older man in trying to understand just what are the lessons to learn for such a lockdown experience. There are always lessons to learn from the past. The temptation for priests is to imagine returning to the same history. But, this 'virus normal' may have a lesson to teach us. The liturgy has taken us into 'ordinary' time. We know that we never return to 'ordinary' time because every day is a new day. Today is the day God has made and now is when we are together to each other. Pushing this friendship deeper in time, we must keep ongoing in space, where we spend much of our life. I can spend more time in the church building while you experience church at home, with family, or even alone if widowed or just plain solitary. We are all aware that the bishops removed the obligation to attend Mass at the parish liturgy. Such a law removes itself without anyone claiming victory power over it because we know an impossible law does not oblige. Are we going to be excited when the obligation is put back in place? I guess not. The pandemic has taught us a positive lesson. Somehow we managed to place church buildings as a more sacred place than others more ordinary. We have priests working there. People seek the presence of God there for help and protection. Priests are like, "go-betweens."

We cannot forget that God is the creator of everything and everyone. He was and is free to create. He creates everything out of nothing. God is holy and all the rest ordinary. Yet, all creation is a sacred space because it reveals who God is. Climate change can be a religious topic. If we have faith, we can be as close to God as wherever else is. God can easily be present to me in the other person. I can be present to Him at the same encounter. We are to be grateful to God. Our thanksgiving can take place in the ordinary world of everyday life. We have been away from liturgical gatherings for quite some time. But we have not missed the fundamental Christian vision because we have been thankful for everyone and everything God has placed before us. Christ risen has been with us in our ordinary life. Even when we open up, we should never replace the authentic everyday life we have lived together through, with Jesus, our trustworthy friend forever.

1. **Oliver Omega** will be on internship (July-August 2021) at Ste Rose-de-Lima Parish in Ste-Rose-du-Lac.

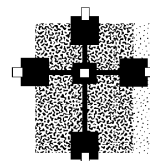
2. **Christopher Pugh** will be on internship (September 2021-June 2022) at St. John Brebeuf Parish in Winnipeg.
