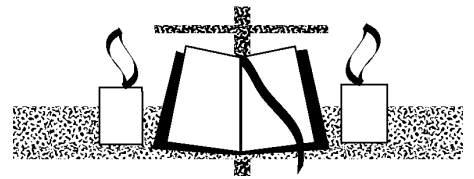

PASTOR'S VIEWPOINT

I am making a quick trip down memory lane today. As many of you know, I was ordained as a Trappist monk. Thomas Merton, a Trappist himself, was very popular in those days. After his accidental death, a group came together under the "International Thomas Merton Society." He wrote a few books and poems. The Society will be meeting soon and will be discussing his work and legacy. Even though he lived in the monastery, he has writings about his time's ecclesial and social crises. In one of his 1964 essays, he begins with the line: "It is no secret that the Church finds herself in crisis, and the awareness of such a fact is 'pessimism' only in the eyes of those for whom all change is necessarily a tragedy." It seems to be the Church is presently navigating waves of criticism. Human structures meet constant challenges, and the spiritual world has complicated ways to come to the surface. Is it possible that we are not paying enough attention to the Holy Spirit? The ongoing temptation is to live in the past. The Holy Spirit is actively breathing and blowing life and love. We must keep on moving with this life and love. If we manage to keep the past victories as stepping stones, we can move forward to new horizons. We have not arrived at perfection—fear of change and losing temporary power keep us idling. The Holy Spirit continually renews the Church and the world. This same action of the Spirit keeps our hope alive. We will need to face the challenges and struggles as they appear before us. No promises of having it easy. We can try doing what we always have been doing. But if the Spirit brings about a greater good, we might need a new approach for full benefits. Pope Francis speaks of a synodal church. We have to work together and in unity. We pastors must cooperate and renew ourselves. The laity is to embrace their baptismal vocation because they are full members of the Body of Christ.

There should not be such an elite group to snap away all authority. Having spent time with the book of Genesis these past few weeks, God is always in charge. Yet His human creatures, in His image journeying towards eternity, must constantly adapt and renew themselves. Hospitality is a standard but continually must adapt itself to the stranger. God loves to visit as a stranger. Today we are invited to recognize Him in all others, with no exceptions. As the Spirit renews the face of the earth, may He renew our eyes of the heart to see life and love right before us in the newness of every day.

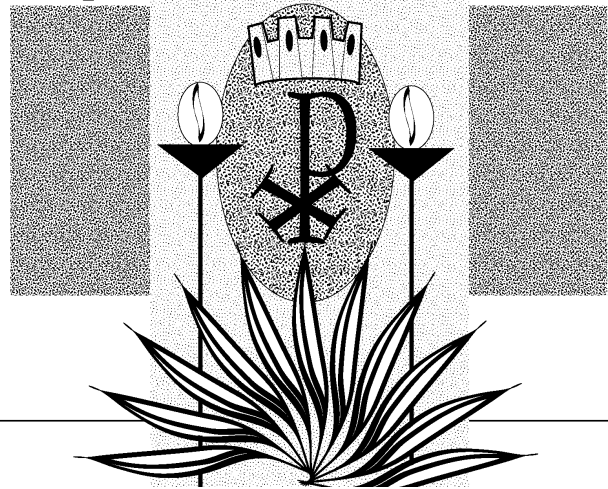

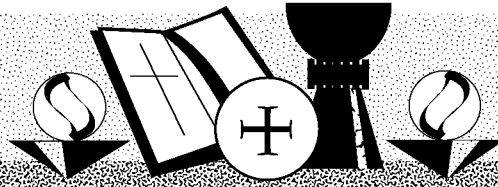
