PASTOR'S VIEWPOINT

Last January, Pope Francis altered a few lines in the code of canon law. The document is called a "motu proprio," and the title was in Latin *Spiritus Domini*. If we take the time to understand what seems to be a slight change, we may appreciate the difference as it affects our parish. If you are old enough, you might remember that it was in 1970 that lay readers made their appearance in our liturgies. Their welcome into action was varied, as might be expected with many critical abled parishioners. The act of reading was another job that a person could now do in church. It took a bit of a high profile because one must stand and face the congregation and speak to be understood. A higher profile job means more difficulties in recruiting. The understanding of being a reader was still some job to be done. As a pastor, one would consider it a new way to be involved, include more people, and encourage active participation. So, pope Francis amends canon law and opens the permanent ministry of lector to women and men. The critical words are a ministry, lector, women, and men. It is no more a reader doing a job. The Liturgy of the Word is fundamental to our celebrating the Eucharist as an assembled community. We celebrate our shared memory: God's covenant, Christ, the first disciples, and ourselves. The text is not just read. It becomes a recollection of who we are, who we should be, and what our hope is.

The place where our memory is shared is genuinely the table of God's Word. The ministry of the lector should be understood and recognized as such. Before we had books, there was a community with memories. The lector serves his brothers and sisters. We should learn how to appreciate the beauty and power of this now-identified ministry. Pope Francis may have changed a couple of lines but caused a liturgical revolution. Moving along to revisit our present experience in daily living, we should recognize the value of authentic memories. Seeking new meanings on historical facts needs authenticity in the facts feeding the memory. The optimum danger is to invent results on false facts. Our gatherings grow from the very person of Christ, the authentic Word of God. The proclaimed Word leads us into relationships with the Risen Christ and one another. As the sun sets on schedule, we should be thankful for another day of love and life. — *Msgr. Maurice Comeault*

Winnipeg Free Press - "'The Pope is a world leader (and) most heads of state get 15 minutes with him,' he said. The amount of time he will spend with the delegations is a sign of 'how important this is to him,' said the archbishop, who countered reports the Pope isn't interested in reconciliation with Indigenous groups. They've been calling for a papal apology after unmarked burial sites were found near former residential schools, including two in B.C., and one in southeastern Saskatchewan.
