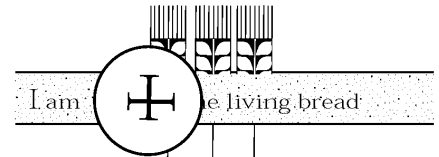

PASTOR'S VIEWPOINT

This past week I was reminded at one of our liturgical celebrations what real commitment is. The stories are well known—the treasure found in a field or someone searching for fine pearls. The same message came across from the mouth of an officer. His testimony expresses what he experienced in the USA on January 6, 2021. The individual put defending the oath taken ahead of his wife and child. Jesus did say that leaving parents is part of the issue when it comes to following Him. This type of spirituality impresses me immensely. I have heard it said and read about two persons in love and living together for a while to look alike, somewhat.

Imagine spending a lifetime listening and speaking to Jesus. Some of us of a certain age should be reflecting that experience in our daily actions. We should also be able to see Him and Hear Him speak to us in the deep recesses of our hearts and souls. Revealing His presence within and among us can warm our hearts and enlighten our minds just as we may visit that type of moment in the company of a dear friend. God is love. Love is present in all He creates. We, too, were created in and by love. Love seeks love. Daily we are looking for God who is love. Let us not be distracted by the beauty of creation. Let us benefit from the experience to grow in friendship with the Lord of life and love.

The hiccups that meet with us will not manifest a deadline or obstacle. Love is stronger than death, stronger than sickness, stronger than any unexpected setback. Love, like a great flickering flame, needs fuel. This reason attracts us to communion—togetherness with the attraction to love and be loved. The sacramental Eucharist calls us. The spiritual connection away from the gathering leads us to a special communion with love. The reality is of a different dimension, at times more real than physicality. 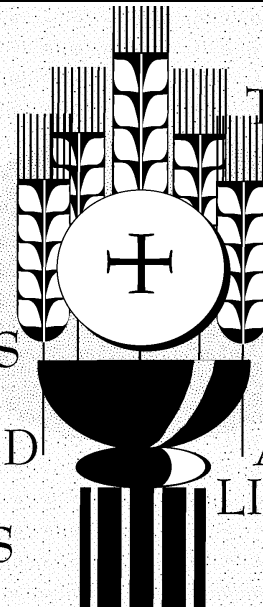

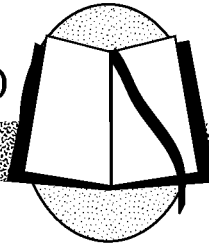
Thrive
