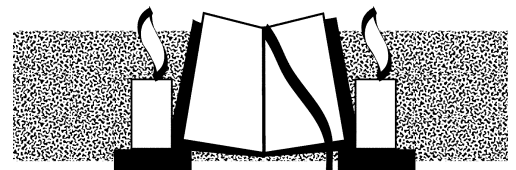

PASTOR'S VIEWPOINT

This weekend will have the Sacrament of Confirmation at the three Masses. The anticipated Mass at 5 pm on Saturday and the 9 am, and 11 am Mass on Sunday. The pandemic being the reason for the delay and for the special arrangement of times and seasons. The archbishop has delegated the parish priests to do the Confirmation celebrations in their parishes. This situation can be utilized as a moment to revisit our own confirmation experience. I remember two things about it, and they do not fall into the 'important' category. Pulling the long train behind the bishop was my job. I have never seen the same since. It was a heavy outfit, and bishop Baudoux insisted I keep it tight and not drag it on the ground. I was a bit scared of him as he would turn around with staring instructions to pull and pull again. I had to wear a special page-like suit.

Then when it came to the ceremony, the bishop walked in the church's aisles asking questions, and if the candidate did not answer, he would question the sponsor. There will not be a long train involved in the ceremony at our parish, and I would be surprised to find many questions addressed to the candidates. The Confirmation experience is an invitation for the whole parish family to welcome the Spirit into their life. Our parish will have the chance to appreciate a fresh manifestation of the Spirit of love. Much like the RCIA journey, the parish is the entire curriculum for preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Sure, we have books and a variety of programs and videos to help out. We are also very thankful to the parents and catechists who devoted time and energy to their calling as ministers of God's love. The candidates coming forward are taking a major step in their faith life. They were taught and told many things, now the time for them to take the commitment seriously. The decision is to give themselves to the building up the road of sharing the Spirit of God in today's world. We, the parish, and every member of the family participate in this celebration of new life. We are also grateful for the gift of the Spirit as Love seeps in and through all of us. Amen.

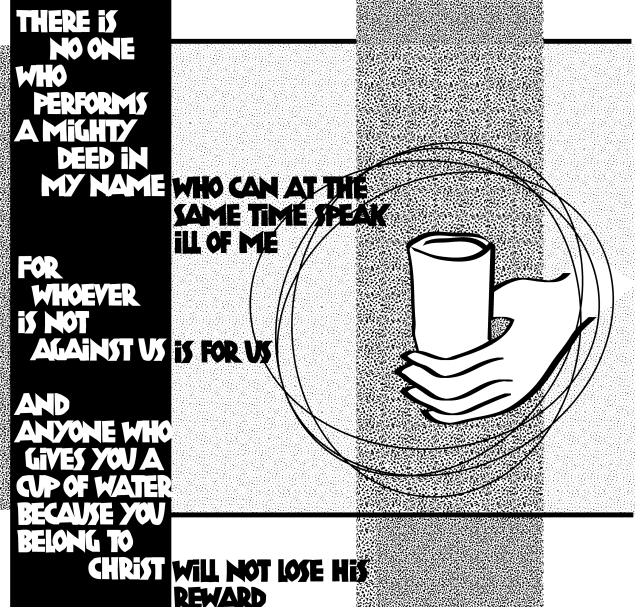

A World Day of Migrants and Refugees is observed in many places in solidarity with the World Refugee Day promoted by the United Nations and observed since 2001 on 20 June. The January observance was instituted by Saint Pius X in 1914. At the request of several conferences of Bishops, Pope Francis moved the observance to September in 2019. “The phenomenon of migration today is a providential opportunity for the proclamation of the Gospel in the contemporary world. Men and women from various regions of the earth who have not yet encountered Jesus Christ or know Him only partially, ask to be received in countries with an ancient Christian tradition. It is necessary to find adequate ways for them to meet and to become acquainted with Jesus Christ and to experience the invaluable gift of salvation.” (Pope Benedict XVI, 2012) —*Ordo 2021*
