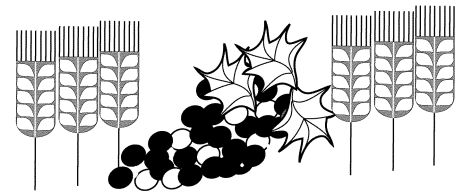

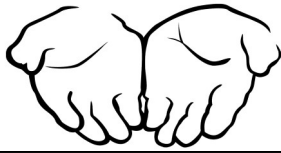

PASTOR'S VIEWPOINT

The synod of Bishops on the topic of youth is now ongoing in Rome. I have taken the time to read the results of the consultation of youth around the world. I have found no other experiences expressed that I cannot find in our own backyards or parking lot of the church. I invite you to pray with me that the church leadership will listen attentively to the Words of the Holy Spirit expressed by the youth experience of our days as well as the direct inspiration they may receive so as to guide or at least suggest authentic guidelines to lead our youth to an experience of the love the Lord has for all of them and all of us.

As I glance outside the office window, I see a rainfall struggling to become snow. Thanks for the roof on the rectory. It is not fooled at all and keeps its cover in pure white, makes me think of the transfiguration garment, as it was so white even a bleach would not be able to match it. Nature has its own tricks and secrets. This snow/rain experience brings me to the spirituality found in some writings of Pope Francis, that is, to look at everyday life as the place of encounter with God; the place where He invites us to healing, freedom, and life. Karl Rahner, a Jesuit theologian, once wrote that the Christian of the future would be a mystic or he would not exist at all. The mystic is the one who opens his eyes to God's presence in the midst of the ordinariness of everyday life. It is not a bad idea to pray for the gift of receiving the insight, or whatever it could be called, to have a conscious contact with God, and improve on this experience as it leads us to "sobriety, happiness, and peace." (Twelve Steps) Now, this reflection brings me to the early days of a new hockey season. We can expect more snow to come, and more hockey and hockey talk. Baseball fans will have to immerse themselves in ball finals, and who knows just what everybody else will dream along their way. In our parish, sacramental life will keep us preoccupied, I am sure. But we must always take the time to place real people as our number one target to love and to serve. This gift of service and intimacy with the Lord can be found wherever you happen to be at any given time. Gratitude and awe will fill our days with Love and Life.

Pilgrimage to the HOLY LAND

- 'Walking with Jesus' November 1-8, 2019 -

Fr. Barry Schoonbaert will be leading a group of pilgrims to the Holy Land with Guide Baligh 'Billy' Jazy of Palestine. The 8-day trip will include such places as Nazareth and the Church of the Annunciation, Bethlehem, and the Church of the Nativity, the Church of the Visitation, the Church of John the Baptist, Cana in Galilee, the Pool of Bethesda and church of St. Anne, Capernaum and Peter's house, the Mt. of Beatitudes, Jericho and the Church of the Good Shepherd, Mt. of Temptation, Jerusalem, the Mt. of Olives, the Garden of Gethsemane, Via Dolorosa, the path of Jesus on the way to Calvary, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher where you find both the place of Crucifixion and the Tomb where Jesus was laid, etc. etc. A complete itinerary is available from Fr. Barry. Mass will be celebrated at one of the Holy Sites each day.

The cost of the tour is \$1675/person double occupancy. Two meals/day, travel coach, hotels, and all entrance fees are included. Airfare will be extra; however, if there is enough interest we are prepared to arrange airfare at a group rate. A \$200 refundable deposit will be required by the end of November 2018 to secure a place on the tour.

There will be an information session on October 20th at 1:00 p.m. at Christ the King Church in Stonewall.
